Policies & Procedures

ARTICLE I TISCA Water Polo Officials

Section 1.01 Water Polo Referee Association

- (a) The TISCA Water Polo committee shall select an independent referee organization every odd year.
- (b) The organization , by-laws, policies and membership requirements shall be developed independent from the TISCA Water Polo Committee
 - i) The policy and certification requirements for TISCA Water Polo officials must be consistent with the policies and by-laws of TISCA Water Polo.
 - ii) The Referee Association must file a copy of their By-Laws as well as their policies concerning TISCA Water Polo with the TISCA Water Polo Committee.
 - iii) The Referee Association shall select a Referee Liaison to the TISCA Water Polo Committee who shall be approved by the TISCA Water Polo Committee.
 - iv) The Referee Association may charge a registration fee for officials to help offset costs of programs for officials (clinics, rule books, other educational materials, development of materials and meeting costs.)
- (c) The Referee Association may organize into local chapters to facilitate local meetings and training.
 - i) Each local chapter should appoint a local referee liaison to communicate and meet with the corresponding local coaches associations.
 - ii) A liaison from the local coaches association is also encouraged to meet with the local referee chapter.
- (e) The Referee Association shall organize a committee specific to TISCA Water Polo Referee Committee
- (b) TISCA Water Polo Referee Committee shall:
 - i) Develop the annual TISCA rules test
 - ii) Develop certification requirements and criteria for advancement as an official;
 - iii) Conduct annual training for certification for officials and conduct other clinics as needed
 - iv) Develop standards of conduct for officials in TISCA
 - v) Counsel, discipline, suspend or remove any official who fails to meet the standards of conduct for officials in TISCA
 - vi) Maintain and publish a list of TISCA Certified Officials

Section 1.02 TISCA Water Polo Officials

- (a) Must be Members in Good Standing with the Referee Association
- (b) Must meet training requirements for TISCA Water Polo set by the Referee Association
- (c) Must pass an annual TISCA Water Polo rules test.
- (d) Must adhere to Standards of Conduct for officials.
 - i) Officials who violate the provisions of this rule may be removed from the list of registered officials.

- ii) The Referee Association shall have a standard due process for referee discipline and sanction and keep a copy of such policies with the TISCA Water Polo Committee

(e) UIL COACHES AND OFFICIALS POSITIVE EXPECTATIONS MEETING (COPE) AND REGISTRATION

- (i) All officials shall satisfy COPE training requirements, either through a joint COPE meeting or other methods prescribed by the UIL, prior to the season.
- (ii) Officials who register and complete COPE training will have their names placed on a COPE list which will be forwarded to the TISCA Water Polo Committee or the Referee Association. This information will be provided by the local chapters and other groups who hold these meetings.
- (iii) Officials who have not completed COPE training will not be allowed to work post district games and should not be used for regular season games. Exceptions will be handled through the TISCA Water Polo Board.
- (iv) Failure of Official to Complete COPE may result in a loss of registration for TISCA contests
- (f) An Officials meeting the above requirements shall be considered a Registered Official

Section 1.02 Referee Fee Schedule

- (a) The Referee Association shall develop a Referee Fee Schedule for TISCA Water Polo competition
- (b) The Fee Schedule may make considerations for variations in competition schedules (Single Game Fees, Dual Game Fees, Tournament Fee, Single Ref vs. Dual Ref, etc) but the Fee Schedule shall be applied uniformly across all regions, chapters, and areas.
- (c) The Fee Schedule may also include reimbursement schedules for travel costs, mileage, and lodging.
- (d) The TISCA Water Polo must approve the Referee Fee Schedule prior to the start of the season.

Section 1.03 National Federation of High School (NFHS) Rules

- (a) Unless otherwise required and/or approved by the TISCA Water Polo Competition Committee, all TISCA Water Polo Competitions shall adhere to NFHS Rules
- (b) If the Competition Committee determines that a change or clarifications to the NFHS rules is necessary prior to or during the season, the Committee shall notify the Referee Liaison, and the Referee Liaison shall notify all TISCA Water Polo Coaches and Officials within 7 days of the determination.

Section 1.04 Tournaments

- (a) Any competition between three or more schools, whether or not all schools compete against each other during the competition, shall be considered a tournament.
- (b) It is recommended that tournaments have a tournament committee with a minimum of 3 persons including the tournament Head Referee.
- (c) The tournament committee may make variations of rules as required to meet the constraints of the facility or tournament.
 - i) Such variations of rules shall be communicated to all tournament coaches and officials at least 30 minutes prior to the first tournament game.
 - ii) Such tournament variations should be limited to rules necessitated by time or facility requirements (time of periods, time outs, start from wall, etc.) and not concerning “rules of play”.
- (d) The tournament committee shall adjudicate any game protests or sanctions that arise during the tournament. Such sanctioning shall not be considered to override or limit any further sanctioning by the TISCA Water Polo committee.
 - i) Game protests shall only be made on mis-application of rules. Protests on an official’s judgment shall not be considered.

Section 1.05 Competition Conduct

- (a) Coaches and Officials are to conduct themselves in a professional manner before, during and after a contest.
- (b) Red Cards and violations of WP 21.11 require both officials of the contest shall submit a report describing the circumstances of the event to the TISCA Water Polo committee within 48 hours of the occurrence for review and potential consequences.
- (c) A brutality foul will result in an immediate exclusion from the game consistent with NFHS WP 21-11, plus suspension through the following game. A player committing a second brutality foul at any point during the season shall be suspended for the remainder of the season including Regional and State tournaments.

Section 1.06 Competition Officials

- (a) **NEUTRAL OFFICIALS.** - In all contests, schools should always attempt to secure neutral officials.
- (b) **REGISTERED OFFICIALS** - Unless otherwise approved by the TISCA Water Polo Board, participant schools shall use Registered Referees in Good Standing with the Referee Association in all contests. If non-registered officials are used for varsity contests, a report shall be filed with the Water Polo Board (within seven days of the contest, if possible).
 - i) A school must contact the TISCA Water Polo Board and receive prior approval before selecting and using non-registered officials for varsity contests.
 - ii) It is recommended that schools use registered officials for non-varsity games.
 - iii) Referees assigned to the regional and state tournaments shall be registered officials.
- (c) **HOST RESPONSIBILITY.**
- (d) The responsibility to obtain satisfactory officials is upon the host school. The host school should contact the local chapter of the Referees Association to obtain referee assignments.
- (e) Officiating chapters should be fair in their game assignments, offering smaller schools the opportunity to use higher level officials when possible.
- (f) **PENALTY.** The penalty for failure to provide officials is forfeiture of the game or match. The TISCA Water Polo Board shall determine whether or not forfeiture is applicable.

Section 1.07 NOTIFICATION.

- (a) The host school must provide names of officials to the visiting school at least 7 days prior to the contest. When names of officials are received by the visiting school, the visiting school shall immediately notify the host school if officials are not satisfactory. Failure of the visiting school to solicit names of officials from the home school within four days of the contest constitutes agreement.
- (b) **AGREEMENT and SCRATCHES**
 - i) Both Officials must be satisfactory to both parties and agreed upon in advance. However, beginning a game with an official constitutes agreement.
 - ii) If a school wishes to scratch an official, the scratching must be in writing and approved by the athletic director in multiple high school districts and the principal and/or superintendent in single high school member districts.
 - iii) Officials shall not be scratched the day of the game, except by mutual consent of both schools. A copy of the letter must be submitted to the other school and the local officials chapter.
 - iv) When officials who have been previously agreed upon by both teams are scratched, the school scratching the officials shall pay them the fee they would have received had they worked the game minus any travel expenses they would have incurred and shall also pay the additional travel and referee costs in obtaining new officials.
 - v) The TISCA Water Polo Committee discourages indiscriminate scratching of officials except in cases when potential problems could result with fans and/or school employees.

(c) PAYMENT of OFFICIALS

- i) The fee listed shall be paid to officials working varsity and sub-varsity contests. If a participant school exceeds or pays less than the fee schedule for a contest, the TISCA Water Polo Committee shall meet as soon as possible to decide if an emergency warranted the fee violation. If the school in question proves an emergency caused the fee violation, the district executive committee does not have to assess a penalty.
- ii) Fees are to be paid by the host school or by the game management as approved by the school. Fees should be paid promptly. Schools that do not pay within 45 days of the contest are subject to the range of penalties listed in Section 29.
- iii) Host schools shall be allowed to charge game or tournament fees to help defray costs of competitions including referees fees. Such competition charges must be approved by all participating schools before the date of the contest.

(d) FAILURE TO SHOW.

- i) If agreed upon officials fail to show, the visiting school shall not be in violation by refusing to play. However, earnest effort should be expended to find officials so that the game may be played without additional travel expenses for team and fans. A host school does not have to forfeit the contest unless the district executive committee rules that they have been negligent in contracting and securing officials.
- ii) The Referee Association must have on file with the TISCA Water Polo committee a copy of their constitutions, rules and by-laws that outline their disciplinary procedures for dealing with officials who fail to honor a chapter assignment. Schools must contact the Referee Association and identify the officials who did not show for a contest so that local officiating chapters can take action.
- iii) When officials do not show, or when the previously agreed upon officials do not show and the game has to be rescheduled, the chapter shall be responsible for the rescheduled game fee, unless it is determined by the local referee chapter that an emergency arose beyond the control of the officials.

Section 1.08 The Referee Liaison acting as the Head Referee for the State Tournament shall be charged with selecting and securing the services of the best eight available officials for the state tournament. Official rankings shall be based on the evaluations and criteria determined by the Referee Association. A minimum of one referee shall be selected from each region. During the state tournament, the Head Referee shall:

- (a) Participate in the pre-tournament coaches meeting answering any questions the coaches may have, and addressing any issues or tournament variations as necessary.
- (b) Conduct a pre-tournament referee meeting. During the referee meeting, the Head Referee shall communicate issues addressed in the coaches meeting and notify the participating referees of the first round game assignments.
- (c) Communicate with coaches and referees of any issues that arise during the tournament.
- (d) Participate as a member of the tournament competition committee.
- (e) Accept any game protests from a coach and notify the coach of the tournament committee's protest ruling.
- (f) Be responsible for referee assignments for all games.. The Head Referee shall work with the tournament Evaluator selected by the Referee Association to make assignments based on performance during the tournament. The Head Referee shall solicit input from the participating coaches as to preferences they have for the 1st place and 3rd place games for each gender.

Section B: Local Chapters shall

Section 2.01 recruit, train, and evaluate referees

Section 2.02 be structured with

- (a) Local Head Referee
- (b) Coaches' Liaison
- (c) Scheduling Coordinator
- (d) Local structure to be named by local Coaches Association

Article II. Competition**Section A: Regular Season**

Section 2.01 The TISCA Water Polo season shall begin no sooner than the end of the UIL Swim Season, and end no later than the last Saturday in April. There shall be no competitions prior to the UIL Texas High School State Swim Championships.

Section 2.02 TISCA Water Polo teams may participate in a fall season as cross training and a pre-season to the UIL Texas High School Swim Season. There shall be no competitions after November 1st. All competitions will be deemed "exhibition" games.

Section 2.03 Each team will be responsible for scheduling varsity and junior varsity games.

Section 2.04 Major rule infractions (i.e.: brutality) must be reported to the TISCA Water Polo Competition Council of the TISCA Water Polo Committee within 48 hours of the occurrence for review and potential consequences.

Section B: Regional Championships

Section 2.05 In order to participate in the TISCA Water Polo State Championships, a prospective team must participate in a regional tournament.

Section 2.06 The regions in TISCA Water Polo shall be:

1. *Houston South (south of I-10)
2. *Houston North (north of I-10 to Bryan College Station)
3. North Texas (North of Temple)
4. South Texas (South of Temple)

NOTE: Regional placement was based 1st on current regional swimming alignment and 2nd on geography.

Section 2.07 Regional tournaments are required to have at least four (4) teams. Each team shall consist of no more than fourteen (14) players.

Section 2.08 The scheduling format of the regional tournaments shall be the responsibility of each of the regional tournament committees.

Section 2.09 Each school shall send the official entry form with the athletes' full name, year in school, and cap number, to the regional tournament director seven days prior to the regional tournament unless the regional committee has authorized other arrangements.

Section C: State Championship

Section 2.10 The state tournament shall be limited to sixteen (16) teams of girls and sixteen (16) teams of boys. Each team shall consist of no more than fourteen (14) players.

Section 2.11 Advancement to the state tournament

- (a) First four (4) teams automatically qualify from the Houston South region (Houston)
- (b) First four (4) teams automatically qualify from the Houston North region (Houston)
- (c) First four (4) teams automatically qualify from the South Texas Region (San Antonio/Austin)
- (d) First four (4) teams automatically qualifies from the North Texas region (Dallas/Fort Worth)

Section 2.12 Each school shall send the official entry forms with the athlete's full name, year in school, and cap number to the tournament director five days prior to the state tournament. This official entry form shall be sent via FAX on the Monday following the regional tournaments.

Section 2.13 The state tournament will follow the current National Federation Rules, unless the TISCA Water Polo Committee has made an exception in writing.

Section 2.14 The date of the state tournament shall be the last Friday and Saturday in April.

Section 2.15 The site of the state tournament shall be based on a rotation between Houston, Austin, Dallas, and San Antonio. The site of the state tournament shall be decided in accordance with a site rotation whereby metropolitan area holds right of preferred bid every fourth year...”

- a. *Dallas in 2009*
- b. *San Antonio in 2010*
- c. *Houston in 2011*
- d. *Austin in 2012...*

Section 2.16 Securing the location of the state tournament is incumbent on the local Region Committees. A presentation for the state tournament will be made at the TISCA Water Polo Annual Meeting, *one year in advance (example: Sept 2010 for April 2012 tournament)*. The TISCA Water Polo Committee will approve the location of state tournament presented by the local Regional Committee by a simple majority.

Section 2.17 Any facility meeting the requirements outlined in the National Federation rulebook shall be considered by the TISCA Water Polo Committee. The possibility of simultaneous games, seating capacity, and lodging will be additional considerations when selecting the site for the state tournament.

Section 2.18 Entry fees shall be determined by the local Region Committees and the host of the state tournament with approval by the TISCA Water Polo Board.

Section 2.19 The TISCA Water Polo Board and HOST working with the local Regional Committee shall appoint a Tournament Director. Below are the primary responsibilities of the local Region Committee, Host, and Tournament Director of the state tournament. Appendix A refers to the state tournament responsibilities of TISCA Water Polo and the local Host/Regional Committee/Tournament Director.

- (a) Shall distribute the tournament information packet with date, location, entry fees, entry deadline, tournament schedule, local hotels and restaurants, at the Fall TISCA Meeting.
- (b) Shall procure a sum of \$200.00 from the TISCA Executive Committee for the operation of the state tournament.
- (c) Shall receive and publish the team rosters, regional results, and other pertinent information in the form of a tournament program.
- (d) Shall publicize the state tournament with local and state media.
- (e) Shall insure the eligibility of all participating athletes.
- (f) Shall execute the state tournament in accordance with the National Federation Rules.
- (g) Shall supply all equipment and auxiliary personnel necessary to administrate the tournament. (ex: a minimum of three (3) new water polo balls are required for each game).
- (h) Shall assist the Head Referee in staffing each game with qualified officials.
- (i) Shall conduct the All-Texas Water Polo Team and Coach of the Year voting as per Appendix B.
- (j) Shall publish the tournament results within ten (10) days of the competition, and submit copies to each of the following:
 - i) Each team that participated in the state tournament
 - ii) The TISCA Executive Director/Secretary for publication
 - iii) Water Polo Scoreboard and Swimming World magazines
 - iv) USWP Southwest Zone Chair

Section 2.20 TISCA Water Polo Reps (2) at state tournament (non-participating TISCA members): state champ game procedures, awards presentation, all state balloting, supervise announcements/announcer, etc. Reps selected by TISCA Water Polo Board and expenses paid by HOST. Work w/host to make sure everything goes well for all involved.

Section 2.21 Competition

- (a) All games are six minute quarters
- (b) All games are played to completion
- (c) Overtime for 5th-16th place consolation games (Saturday) play 3:00 minute sudden victory periods (first team who scores wins the games). All other games play normal NFHS rules for overtime.
- (d) Championships round will be scheduled in the following order: 3rd place girls, 3rd place boys, 1st Place girls, 1st place boys
- (e) Region Crossovers will rotate each year:
 - i. Odd Years: South Houston v. North Texas & North Houston v. South Texas
 - ii. Even Years: South Houston v. South Texas & North Houston v. North Texas
- (f) Big Pool for Championship Games is optional (but only if completed within 30 minutes or less)
- (g) Hosts shall use the State Tournament Schedule in Appendix C.

Section 2.22 Referees

- (a) Host pays all ref costs for State Tournament (game fees, hotel, per diem and mileage)
- (b) Ref pay is \$25 per game (including goal judges for championship games)
- (c) Pay Referee Hotel for 3rd night of championship
- (d) All Referees are assigned by the selected Referee Association

Section 2.23 Awards

- (a) Official TISCA Water Polo banners shall be awarded to the top three (3) teams in the girls' and the boys' competition.
- (b) No individual awards shall be presented to any members of the top three (3) teams, with the exception of All-State and MVP awards.

Article III. Region Committees

Section 3.01 Regions of TISCA Water Polo: the regions of TISCA Water Polo will be decided by the TISCA Water Polo Board in even numbered years in the summer after the spring state tournament. The regions will be in place for two years. Additions (no subtractions or switching regions) to the regions may occur during this two year period but only at the approval of the TISCA Water Polo Board and the local Region Committee. The current Regions with member schools of TISCA Water Polo is listed in Appendix D.

1. *Houston South (south of I-10)
2. *Houston North (north of I-10 to Bryan College Station)
3. North Texas (North of Temple)
4. South Texas (South of Temple)

NOTE: For the Houston Regions placement was based 1st on current regional swimming alignment and 2nd on geography.

Section 3.02 Local Region Structure

- (a) Region Committees: 3-5 person committees responsible for above. TISCA Water Polo Board member from Region is automatically chair of local region committee. Other committee members are selected at TISCA Water Polo Annual Meeting in even numbered years (same year as Board) in Region Breakout sessions at end of general TISCA Water Polo Meeting. Region board member supervises election for each region and reports to TISCA Water Polo Chair. Removal/Replacement of Local Region Committee members is the same as TISCA Water Polo Board (with final approval by the TISCA Water Polo Board).
- (b) One member of Local Region Committee is the treasurer.
- (c) Each Local Region will have an individual bank account to handle district/region business.
- (d) Local Region Committee reports at TISCA Water Polo Annual Meeting (5-10 minutes each).

Section 3.03 Local Region Responsibilities

- (a) District/Region Champ Schedule
- (b) Organize and Operate Region Tournament
- (c) Pay Refs/Pool for District/Region Games (need bank account-see below)
- (d) Resolve Local Region Issues
- (e) Grassroots Growth of Sport
- (f) All Region Selections (standard across all regions)-see below
- (g) Facilitate State Tournament when in Region
- (h) Regional tournament director responsible for passing on region qualifier rosters

Section 3.04 Local Region General Issues:

- (a) All Region Balloting needs to be consistent between regions and to State Tournament
- (b) All Region Voting will use the same guidelines as All State voting in Appendix B
- (c) Awards between Regions need to be standardized (possible sponsor for All Region Awards throughout State)

Article IV. Discipline Requests and Protest Procedures

Section 4.01 All coaches, officials, and competition personnel shall be required to follow professional standards of conduct.

Section 4.02 All matters involving discipline and/or progress must be made in writing to the Water Polo Competition Council immediately upon the discovery of the facts on which the Discipline Request is based. The Discipline Request must be signed by the Superintendent of Schools, or his/her designated administrator.

Section 4.03 If a member of the TISCA Water Polo Competition Council is involved in the discipline or game protest that individual shall step down, and the Water Polo Chairman shall appoint a suitable replacement for the tenure of that decision only.

Section 4.04 Officials must report all ejections of coaches, severe verbal and physical abuse and any major disruptions that occur during a game. The game administrator is to be informed of the problem the day of the game. Written reports from each official involved are to be submitted to the Referee Association within the next four working days following the game or tournament.

Section 4.05 A brutality foul will result in an immediate ejection, plus suspension through the following game. A player committing a second brutality foul will be suspended for the season

Section 4.06 Discipline Requests

- (a) Discipline Requests from either an official against a coach or a coach against an official may not be considered or adjudicated by the TISCA Water Polo Board unless the official has received COPE Training prior to the season.
- (b) Discipline Requests shall be considered concerning violation Codes of Conduct, violation of the TISCA Water Polo By-Laws or Policy, eligibility, tournament operation. The Discipline Request shall note such concerns.

Section 4.07 Game Protests

- (a) Game Protests shall be adjudicated by the TISCA Water Polo Competition Committee
- (b) Game Protests based on a referee's decision or judgment shall not be considered. Only game protests concerning a rules or by-law misapplication.
- (c) If a game protest is upheld, the Competition Committee may determine the appropriate action to take including but not limited to replaying the game, uphold the game results, or nullify the results (game never occurred)
- (d) If a tournament committee exists, such game protests shall first be adjudicated by the tournament committee to allow for expedient correction. Such protests shall then be forwarded to the Competition Committee for further review.

APPENDIX B: All-Texas Selection Process

Section A: Selection Eligibility

1. Any athlete or coach participating in a TISCA sanctioned water polo program, and in good standing with the Texas Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association, and the University Interscholastic League, is eligible for this honor.
2. Participation at the state tournament is not required to be considered for All-Texas

Section B: Voter Eligibility

1. Any coach participating in a TISCA sanctioned water polo program, and in good standing with the Texas Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association and their respective eligibility authority, is eligible to vote.
2. Participation at the state tournament is required in order to vote for All-Texas.

Section C: Selection Procedure

1. The tournament director will provide the official ballots and conduct the voting.
2. The tournament director and TISCA Water Polo Reps shall count the ballots thirty (30) minutes after the final game. Any coach is welcome to witness the process, but must remain impartial.
3. The tournament committee has the power to disqualify any ballot if, in their opinion, the ballot is bogus, or an attempt was made to contaminate the outcome of the selection process.
4. The tournament director shall provide separate coaches' ballots for girls and boys.
5. A player shall receive three (3) points for an MVP vote, two (2) points for a First Team vote, and one (1) point for a Second Team vote
6. A list of the nominees (usually the state tournament program), which includes the regional results, is recommended, but not required.
7. The ballot shall contain twelve (12) blanks for the First Team selections, with the first name listed being the Most Valuable Player (MVP). These shall be listed as 1-12. Twelve (12) additional blanks for the Second Team selections shall be listed as numbers 13-24.
8. Coaches may not vote for any player on their own team. Coaches must turn in a completed ballot in order for that coach's players to be eligible for consideration. The voter must sign all ballots.
9. The final All State Teams shall consist of twelve (12) first team selections, twelve (12) second team selections, and twelve (12) honorable mention selections.
